DOLE INTRODUCES WHEAT LEGISLATION

Bill No. 6547 introduced by Bob Dole just two days after farmers voted "no" on the referendum of 1963 contained four main points:

- Voluntary Program giving farmers the right to interchange wheat and feed-grain acreage. It was a local, individual choice.

- 2 Payment in kind for diverted acreage,

DOLE ALSO

- Introduced legislation to increase sugar beet acreage in Western Kansas. This crop is in short supply at home and the American farmer—not the foreign farmer -should be given preference.
- 2 Dole introduced legislation, voted for, and fought for a limit on the import of beef from abroad. The market value of eatile sold by Kansas farmers in 1963 declined \$150,000,000 while imports of beef from abroad increased sharply.
