Hutchinson-Rep. Bob Dole joined other House members today in demanding a meaningful reduction in the level of oil imports and correction of a growing abuse by the Department of Defense in the purchase of petroleum from foreign sources.

Dole, who spoke in support of the tagislation introduced by Omar Burleson, a Texas Democrat, pointed out that imports now excede 2 million, three hundred thousand barrels a day. We further pointed out that the Defense Department now buys more than one-third of its aviation gasoline and jet fuel abroad. "These purchases", Dole stated, "amount to more than 200,000 barrels daily. We said that the Department of Defense has turned a deaf ear to pleading by many membrs of Congress and by the domestic oil industry to reduce these foreign oil purchases.

The Demense Department states they can buy foreign oil a little cheaper but Dole said he questions seriously the "savings" on foreign oil products when these purchases add \$300 million a year to our over-all payments deficit. "There are serious questions in my mind concerning these "savings" when I look at the shrinkage in the domestic industry, the reduced incomes, reduced employment, and reduced tax payments to our local, federal, and state governments." As a example, Dole said that five years ago independent oil men were operating 169 rigs in Kansas, but on January 21 of this year they were operating only 49.
