Washington There may be better days ahead for reapportionment", according to Rep. Bob Dole. Dole made the statement apen completion of an informal poll with reference to reapportionment.

Each member was asked if he would vote for the Constitutional amendment whereby one House would be apportioned on factors other than population. Of the 140 Republicans, 124 voted yes; 3 no; 13 undecided. Dole, a member of a bi-partisan steering committee, said a Democrat member of the committee reported 120 Democrates voted yes; 134 seeinst; 40 undecided.

Cong. Dole pointed out that it takes 2/3 of those voting in the House and Senate to enact the resolution calling for an amendment and in a letter to Dole, Senator Everett Dirksen indicated they could get the 2/3 vote in the Senate.
