Washington—"There may be better days ahead for re-apportionment", according to Rep. Bob Dole. Dole made the statement <sup>following</sup> upon completion of an informal poll ~~with no consensus~~ taken among House members with reference to reapportionment.

Each member was asked if he would vote for the Constitutional amendment whereby one House would be apportioned on factors other than population. Of the 140 Republicans, 124 voted yes; 3 no; 13 undecided. Dole, a member of a bi-partisan steering committee, said a Democrat member of the committee reported 120 Democrats voted yes; 134 <sup>no</sup> ~~against~~; 40 undecided.

Cong. Dole pointed out that it takes 2/3 of those voting in the House and Senate to enact the resolution calling for an amendment and in a letter to Dole, Senator Everett Dirksen indicated they could get the 2/3 vote in the Senate.
