"Clean Elections" Amendment

Congressman Bob Dole praised ~~the~~ Senate action, Thursday April 29, 1965, in adopting by unanimous vote the modified "clean elections" amendment to the "Votong Rights" bill submitted by Senator John Williams of Delaware. This amendment makes it a Federal offense for anyone to give false information in connection with registering to vote, to pay or accept payment for registering or for voting, with respect to any Federal election.

Congressman Dole has been working on similar legislation in the House and has suggested the Williams amendment be further modified when the Voting Rights bill reaches the House to include provisions to make it a Federal crime to alter any ballot or voting record or to fraudulently count ballots, with respect to any Federal election.
