Dear Mr. Dole:

In response to your letter of November 1, 1965, regarding the award of the C-5A contract. I can assure you that we share your concern over the impact the announcement of such an award can have on the stock market.

With these facts in mind, all feasible security measures were taken to safeguard this information before it was officially released to the public.

We have directed that an investigation be conducted within the Department of Defense (DoD) in an effort to determine the source of the premature release of this infor-The DoD investigators have been working very closely with the Securities and Exchange Commission in regard to their investigation into the marketing aspect of the case. This investigation is continuing.
