Congressman Bob Dole (R-Kans) is pictured receiving the "Watchdog of the Treasury Award" from the National Associated Businessmen, Inc., in honor of his 100% economy voting record for the 89th Congress. He received a similar award in 1964.

The award this year was based on 10 key votes during the first and second sessions of the 89th Congress. NAB President Elton Kile, in presenting the award, said, "The votes on these measures pointed up the Member's overall attitude toward spending versus economy in government."

Dole has consistently voted against extravagant government spending. As examples, Dole voted for foreign aid reduction, against debt limit increase, for reductions in the poverty program, for elimination of rent supplements, and for reducing appropriations for the Post Office and Treasury.

In congratulating Dole, Kile said, "Your outstanding economy voting record indicates to our membership that you have a keen realization of fiscal responsibility. I congratulate you on the courage you have shown in standing up to oppose those who are blind to the possibility of increasing the efficiency and the reduction in the scale of federal programs."
