Hutchinson-Thirty-six young men from the First Congressional District, who are interested in service academy appointments, will be interviewed Saturday, November 26, by a Screening Board appointed by Rep. Bob Dole.

The meeting will be held in Sheridan Coliseum on the campus of Fort Hays State College, and will convene at 8:30 a.m. Dole will not be present at the meeting. A member of the House Committee on Government Operations, he accompanied four other members of the committee to Europe where they will be reviewing market promotion activities of the Foreign Agricultural Service.

According to Rep. Dole, outstanding residents of the First District are members of the Screening Board and each applicant is considered on a completely impartial basis, thus assuring the selection and nomination of the best qualified boys.

Dr. Richard E. Burnett, Assistant to the President of Fort Hays State College, who has served as chairman of the board for a number of years, will again serve in this capacity. Other members are: Mrs. A. M. Shatzell, Hoxie; Forrest Stamper, Plainville; Leo Paulsen, Concordia; Jim Shaw, Ashland; George Meeker, Phillipsburg; Sam Stitt, Ellinwood; Robert Jennison, Healy; George Baxter, Russell; Mrs. R. C. Rolfs, Lorraine; Mrs. Howard Muncy, Dodge City; Robert Cram, St. Francis, and Mrs. Glen Hays, Ransom.

The Board will again be assisted by "technical advisors", who are well qualified men with an interest in the Academies. They are Lt. Colonel Lester Ruegsegger, Salina; Lt. Commander William Dixon, Hutchinson, Colonel Kenneth Peters, Larned, and Captain James T. Killilea, Hays.

The Board will recommend two boys for principal appointments to the Naval Academy, and two to the Army Academy. Congressman Dole has no vacancy to the Air Force Academy this year. Boys who indicated they will appear before the Board are:
