Congressman Bob Dole (R-Kans) today introduced legislation, which is upported by major farm organizations, aimed at controlling unfair trade pracices affecting producers of agricultural products and associations of agriultural producers.

"This bill," Dole said, "is important to the freedom of our farmers and o the future of agriculture. It is designed to protect the right of agriculcural producers to decide free from pressure whether or not they wish to belong o marketing or bargaining associations."

Dole pointed out that because of the increasing concentration of the marketing and distribution of agricultural products in the hands of fewer buyers, many farmers feel very strongly that they should have the right to organze and compete without fear of reprisal or of unfair trade practices.

"They believe that the wider use of contract marketing has created a reater need for the strengthening of their own bargaining position in order o secure prices and benefits which they rightfully feel they are entitled to. he bill," Dole emphasized, "simply provides farmers with an opportunity to improve their own lot through their own action." Dole added that the bill is

low pending before the House Committee on Agriculture, of which he is a member.
