WASHINGTON, D.C., March 13 -- Congressman Bob Dole (R-Kans.), candidate for the U.S. Senate, issued the following statement on the results of the New Hampshire primary election:

"The New Hampshire primary reflects a deep division in the Democrat party. Democrats now have at least three choices -- Johnson, Wallace and McCarthy -- with a fourth possibility in Senator Robert Kennedy who might be willing to stick his neck out now that McCarthy has tested the water.

"The vote cannot be considered strictly anti-Vietnam, but rather an anti-LBJ vote. The citizens of New Hampshire and across the nation have obviously had enough. For the good of America, I trust the Johnson-Humphrey Administration has finally gotten the message.

Democrats and all Americans have a fifth choice: to elect a Republican."
