WASHINGTON, D.C., May 23 -- There are two senators in the Bob Dole household now.

Robin, 14-year-old daughter of U.S. Senator and Mrs. Bob Dole (R-Kans.), was elected girl senator of the 1969-70 sophomore class at J.E.B. Stuart high school in Falls Church, Va. Thursday.

Robin, along with a boy senator, will represent 524 sophomore during the next school year at J.E.B. Stuart. She defined the role of a senator as "helping to fill the communications gap between the class officers and the students."

During the school's primary and general elections, Robin campaigned using the same symbol on her campaign materials her father has used since he was first elected to the House of Representatives in 1960 -- the pineapple.
