VASHINGTON, D.C., Oct. 20 -- An artist and former Midwestern football star -- Roland "Kickapoo" Logan -- of Palm Springs, Calif. will present one of his paintings to President Nixon Tuesday.

Logan, who was born near Kickapoo, Kans., in 1906, signs his paintings "Kickapoo Logan".

The 30" x 20" seascape shows a turbulent ocean lashing against the rocky shorline. Accompanying Logan to the White House will be his wife, the former Helena Dietrich, a native of Silver Lake, Kans. and U.S. Senator James Pearson, U.S. Senator Bob Dole and U.S. Representative Chester Mize, all R-Kans.

Logan, who attended Leavenworth, Kans., schools, also attended the University of Kansas, Lawrence, where he starred as a guard on the football team.

After college, he was an athletic trainer for the Boxton Red Sox and later for

the U.S. Military Academy in West Point, N.Y.

Following World War II in which he served as a naval commander in the South Pacific, he was employed in athletic equipment manufacturing.

The American Institute of Fine Arts recently presented its Gold Medal Award to Logan.
