SHAWNEE MISSION, KANSAS, Nov. 1---"Don't be too timid to stand up for what you believe and to seek change where you see the need,"

U.S. Senator Bob Dole (R-Kans.) told high school students attending a Business and Professional Women's Youth Conference here today.

"Your youth is important to yourselves and your nation," he said. "You must not let it pass without taking every opportunity to express and employ your energies, your visions and even your illusions.

"Don't be discouraged by defeat, for you will not always win. But your youth is your strength and there will be more causes and more struggles."

Dole said the Youth Crusade of last year's Presidential campaign was a "great thing for American politics.

"Naturally, everyone's candidate did not win, but those whose men were not the victors should not give up. Winners in politics are not the dropouts. The winners are the ones who keep working and who keep trying.

"Richard Nixon kept trying and he's now in the White House.

"Politics needs youth as much as it needs integrity, as much as it needs intelligence a more than it needs images or rhetoric. We cannot afford to let the talent of youth go untapped."
