WASHINGTON, D.C. Sept. 15 -- U.S. Senator Bob Dole (R-Kans.) today hailed tomorrow's visit of President Richard Nixon to Kansas State University, Manhattan, as "another effort to communicate with college students and a tribute to a great American, Alf Landon."

Dole pointed out that while the President has made a number of efforts to communicate with students, the Manhattan speech will be his first major address to students this year.

"Although the program is designed primarily for students and faculty," Dole said, "there will be room outside the K-State field house and there will be seats in the old football stadium. The entire area will be equipped with loudspeakers.

"It is my hope that thousands of Kansans, young and old, will turn out to greet their President."

The seven members of the Kansas delegation will leave Washington, D.C. at 8:45 am (Ks. time) aboard Air Force One with the President. The plane will land at Forbes Air Force Base and passengers will be taken to Manhattan via helicopter.
