WASHINGTON, D.C. Oct. 29 -- U.S. Senator Bob Dole (R-Kans.) has been awarded the National Associated Businessmen's (N.A.B.) "Watchdog of the Treasury" award for his 90 percent economy voting record for the Ninety-First Congress.

The percentage figure was taken from the N.A.B.'s Economy Voting Record which analyzed the voting patterns of the 91st Congress, based on twelve votes in the Senate and twelve votes in the House.

Dole was one of 25 Senators who received a miniature gold bulldog symbolizing the award. The 25 Senators qualified by their record of voting 75 percent or more for economy and against inflation.

The N.A.B. has been rating members of Congress on their votes for fiscal responsibility since 1964.
