WASHINGTON, D.C. Oct. 30, 1970 -- U.S. Senator Bob Dole today commended the Forgotten Americans Committee of Kansas, Inc. for their November 7-14 city-wide drive in Wichita for letters of concern for prisoners of war and men missing in action in Southeast Asia.

The drive will also include McConnell Air Force Base and Wichita State University.
