WASHINGTON, D.C., NOV. 6, 1970 -- The appointment of Mrs. Glenn (Ailee) Henry of Oskaloosa, Kansas, to the National Advisory Committee of the White House Conference on Aging was announced today by U.S. Senator Bob Dole.

Mrs. Henry's term begins immediately and extends to May 31, 1972.

Mrs. Henry, the wife of an Oskaloosa dentist, will join 27 other distinguished Americans appointed to the committee including another Kansas, Dr. Milton Eisenhower, President of John Hopkins University and a native of Abilene.

Dole, who strongly endorsed Mrs. Henry for this position, described her as, "eminently qualified for this assignment, a capable person and a most charming lady in the finest sense of the word.
