President Nixon writes in the book, "This publication presents the latest scientific answers to some of the questions most frequently asked about drug misuse. For the first time, all of the concerned Federal agencies and departments have pooled their knowledge to produce a single source book on the national drug problem."

"The answers are based upon the latest research findings of the National Institute of Mental Health and are presented in accord with the policies and programs of the Defense Department, the Department of Justice, the Department of Labor and the Office of Economic Opportunity."

Senator Dole reported that at the present time the books are only available on a "one to a person" basis but that larger numbers could be obtained at 25¢ per copy by writing the Superintendent of Documents (Dept. D), Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402.
