WASHINGTON, D.C., MARCH 5, 1971 -- U.S. Senator Bob Dole today joined in cosponsoring five different types of Enviromental Legislation. The enviromental measures, originally proposed by the Administration, are designed to restore and enhance our natural

enviroment.

The legislation would:

1) provide increased assistance to State and interstate water pollution control program

2) provide a new framework of financial assistance to States and municipalities for the construction of waste treatment works;

3) relate to the establishment and enforcement of water quality standards;

4) assist municipalities in financing their share of waste treatment works construction costs;

5) establish and enforce standards governing the generation of noise.

The Kansas Senator called these proposals, "wide in range and broad in scope."
