WASHINGTON, D.C., May 3 --- U.S. Sen. Bob Dole (R-Kans.) cosponsored recently two bills dealing with military personnel.

Senate Bill 908, Dole said, would amend the Military Selective

Service Act of 1967 specifically exempting from induction and training
the surviving sons of a familiary that has lost two or more members
as the result of military service.

The Kansas Senator also sponsored Senate Bill 325, which would establish a Survivors Benefit Plan for military personnel.

Dole said this measure would enable career military personnel to provide for their surviving loved ones in the event of their death. This bill would establish a new survivors annuity program under which the military retiree could assure his surviving dependents of up to 55 per cent of his retirement pay. Dole commented:

"Many people do not realize that the widow of a retired military man does not automatically receive part of the earned retirement pension her husband was receiving at the time of his death.

Both bills are pending before the Senate Committee on the Armed Forces, Dole said.
