U.S. Sen. Bob Dole (R-Kans.) said today that the recently announced 1971 loan rates for grain sorghum will mean that the price support loan rate will increase 12 cents per hundredweight in every county in Kansas.

A member of the Senate Agricultural Credit and Rural Electrification Subcommittee, Dole explained, "The increase in loan rates came about as a result of the new farm program outlined in the Agricultural Act of 1970. The act requires grain sorghum loan rates be determined by its feed value in relation to corn and its corresponding feed value."
