WASHINGTON, D.C., JUNE 3, 1971 -- U.S. Senator Bob Dole today announced the appointment of Robert L. Rebein, a native of Ellinwood, Kansas, as the Interstate Commerce Commission's Assistant Managing Director, the agency's number two staff position.

Rebein will be an assistant to ICC Chairman, George M. Stafford, also a Kansan.

Rebein, a former Congressional attorney and FBI agent, received his law degree from the University of Kansas in 1954, having previously been awarded a B.S. degree in accounting from the same school. Rebein has been addmitted to practice before the Kansas Supreme Court, the Federal District Court of Kansas and the United States Supreme Court.
