WASHINGTON, D.C., JUNE 7, 1971 -- U.S. Senators Bob Dole and James Pearson today announced that Kansas has received three "grants-in-aid" from the Department of Interior. The grants will be used to help protect and restore historic spots in Kansas.

The grants are provided for under the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 and are administered by the National Park Service to assist the states and the National Trust for Historic Preservation. All grants are matched by an equal or greater amount of state or local money.

The grants for Kansas cover; The Goodnow House Acquistion and Development Project in Manhattan, \$6,954; Fort Hays Development Project in Fort Hays, \$10,000; and the Grinter Place Development Project in Topeka, \$25,000.
