WASHINGTON, D.C., Jan. 4, 1971 ---- U.S. Sen. Bob Dole (R-Kans.) said today he was "particularly pleased" at the announcement by Secretary of Agriculture Earl Butz that the White House has released \$55,500,000 to be added to funds for the Rural Environmental Assistance Program (REAP).

Dole explained that the funds announced today will bring the total funding to \$195 million, since \$140,000,000 of the appropriation had been released earlier. The Kansas Senator said he was pleased by today's action because it will "enable Kansas farmers to continue their land improvement and conservation programs funded by REAP."

Dole, who had been urging the White House to release the funds, said that he expected to know in a few days as to how much of the money would be going for Kansas use.
