WASHINGTON, D.C., FEB. 22, 1973 -- Senator Bob Dole today learned that the EPA has revised their proposed regulations that would have required a \$10 license fee on every type of drainage point on every farm.

EPA is attempting to rewrite these regulations to include the following:

- (1) Obtain congressional consent that the law provides EPA the right to exempt some points of discharge when they determine these points will not pollute the rivers and streams.
- (2) Based on the above EPA would then exempt drainage points found in general farming operations.
- (3) EPA would require those farming operations they determine would be polluting rivers and streams to register and meet certain requirements.

 EPA indicated that they are tentatively considering:
 - * animal feedlots (cl,000 head of cattle or 2500 head of hogs over 55 lbs.)
 - * Dairy farming operations of 700 cows or more
 - * poultry operations of 100,000 birds
 - * return flow irrigation; with 3,000 acres or more in a single system.
- (4) When a state complies with the EPA general guidelines, EPA will allow the state to administer and enforce the program to eliminate duplication.
