OTTAWA, KANSAS, MARCH 5, 1973 -- Senator Bob Dole, speaking to the Ottawa Chamber of Commerce this evening at Ottawa University said, "What the President wants to do, in its simplest terms, is make the 92nd Congress the last of the big spenders and get this one, the 93rd, to take a more careful look at what we can afford to spend and what we out to be spending it for."

Dole said it will be a tough job to halt extrabagant federal spending programs that have been allowed to grow into ~~the~~ enormous bureaucratic giant over the past 40 years.

The Kansas Senator added that although he didn't agree with the President in every particular of his budget, "by and large, I applaud what he has done and I plan to do everything I can to help him meet his objective."

Dole said that President Nixon is rethinking the things this government does and the things it tries to do. "He has redefined American foreign policy and gotten us away from the bief that we had to fight everybody else's wars for them. He hasn't retreated from our responsibility as a great power."

Dole said that President Nixon has proposed a three part solution to the problems caused by big government. Revenue sharing, government reorganization and his plan to cut back on federal spending.
