AFTER SOME DELAY IN SCHEDULING SUBCOMMITTEE CONSIDERATION
OF THE TOPEKA PROJECT, I CONTACTED THE CHAIRMAN AND RANKING
REPUBLICAN MEMBER LAST WEEK. THEY GAVE THEIR ASSURANCES THAT THE
TOPEKA BUILDING WOULD BE GIVEN TOP PRIORITY. I AM PLEASED THAT THE
SUBCOMMITTEE HAS ACTED, AND, HOPEFULLY, THE LAST STEP IN THE APPROVAL
PROCESS CAN BE TAKEN IN THE NEAR FUTURE.
