WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Senator Bob Dole today announced Senate approval of a \$20 million Bureau of Outdoor Recreation appropriation to establish a special fund for assistance to states such as Kansas which have expended prior year allocations. The regular appropriation for the Bureau of Outdoor Recreation program was reduced substantially this year due to a backlog of unexpended funds at the state level. Today's action sets up a special fund to assist states such as Kansas which have utilized all their prior year's funds and whose program would be detrimentally affected unless additional funds were made available. Under the Senate bill, allocations to Kansas from this special fund would not be counted against future year allocations.

The Bureau of Outdoor Recreation program is administered in

Kansas by the State Park and Resources Authority which provides

matching funds to communities interested in developing outdoor

recreational facilities. Currently there are 55 Kansas applications

which remain unfunded and an additional 50 applications are expected to be well-but next year. Dole had requested that an additional \$20 million be appropriated for this special fund but only a \$4 million increase

was approved by the Senate, body. Funds for the program are non-tax revenues accumulated from lease income on outer shelf oil rights, the sale of surplus Federal property, and income from motor boat fuel taxes.
