WASHINGTON, D.C.--The Senate Finance Subcommittee on Energy and the Senate Select Subcommittee on Small Business will both hold extensive hearings this week into the ramifications of the current energy crisis. Senator Bob Dole, a member of both and ranking Republican on the Finance Subcommittee, said he hoped that results of the hearings would help the Senate formulate its policy concerning future energy use in the United States.

The Finance Subcommittee on Energy will meet Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday to question White House Energy Advisor John Love and Treasury Secretary George Shultz. Senator Dole has said he plans to question them closely on fuel export policies and practices.

The Senate Select Subcommittee on Small Business will also hold hearings on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday to determine the impact of the energy crisis on small business. Appearing before the Subcommittee will be Admiral Reich, Director of the Petroleum Allocation Office; representatives of other agencies in both the federal and state governments and representatives of small businesses.
