## OZARKS COMMISSION APPROVES FUNDS FOR IOLA SEWER IMPROVEMENTS

WASHINGTON, D.C.--Senator Bob Dole today announced approval of a \$52,600 grant to stimulate industrial expansion and economic growth in Allen County, Kansas. The grant notification was made by Bill H. Fribley, Federal Co-Chairman of the Ozarks Regional Commission.

This project will provide for expansion of the existing sewer system by construction of new holding basins, sewer lines and lift stations to provide service to new industrial sites. The improvements will also allow expansion of existing industry by providing adequate sewer facilities to meet their needs. The Environmental Protection Agency is providing \$789,000 and local funds in the amount of \$210,400 will complete the total project cost of \$1,052,000.

The Ozarks regional Commission was established under the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965 to map and carry out long range programs, to help stimulate economic development in the five-state Ozarks region of Arkansas, Kansas Louisiana, Missouri, and Oklahoma.
