## OUTREACH PROGRAM FOR TOPEKA MINORITY YOUTHS TO BE FUNDED

WASHINGTON, D.C.--Senators Bob Dole and James Pearson today announced an Apprentice-ship Outreach Program for Topeka to be funded through the Manpower Administration of the Department of Labor. The Program will be conducted by the AFL-CIO Human Resources Development Institute at an estimated cost of \$66,600.

It will prepare 33 minority youths to pass apprentice-entrance tests through a concentrated tutoring program of up to ten weeks. Youths receive instruction in mathematics, reading, and other trade-related subjects. Tests are given by joint apprentice-ship committees representing management and labor in such trades as carpentry, bricklaying, and plumbing, as local openings occur.
