## KANSAN NAMED TO FHA POST

TOPEKA, KANSAS--Senator Bob Dole today announced the appointment of Frank W. Naylor, Jr., a native Kansan, as associate administrator of the Farmers Home Administration by Secretary of Agriculture Earl L. Butz. The appointment is effective today.

Naylor was recommended for the post by Senator Dole. He was formerly deputy manager of the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation and returns to the Department of Agriculture from the Veterans Administration where he has been executive assistant to the administrator since April 1973.

As associate administrator, Naylor will share with FHA Administrator Frank B. Elliott the day-to-day operations of the agency and act for the administrator in his absence.

A native of Mulvane, Kansas, Naylor first joined USDA in May of 1969 as deputy manager of FCIC, a position he held until March 1972. He came into the Department from Kansas City, where he was a staff manager of a large life insurance office where he had obtained experience in insurance, claims administration, underwriting and marketing.

During his service in FCIC, he was responsible for implementing a complete reorganization of the agency's national office and field structure. At the VA, Naylor has been the agency's top advisor in such areas as reorganization, consolidation or decentralization of federal functions and operations and improvements in field organization.

The new FHA associate administrator is a graduate of Kansas University where he earned his bachelor's degree with a major in international relations. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1961 to 1965, reaching the rank of lieutenant. He received the Navy Commendation Medal for combat service in Vietnam.

Naylor, 35, is married to the former Karen S. Marks. They reside with their two children in McLean, Virginia.
