## MANPOWER PROGRAMS EXTENDED IN KANSAS

WASHINGTON, D.C.--Senators Bob Dole and James Pearson today announced Department of Labor grants to Kansas totalling \$1.75 million. Money will be used to extend the Work Incentive program and a number of local manpower projects in the State.

\$1,323,000 went to the Kansas Employment Security Division to continue the Work Incentive (WIN) program through June. The program registers employable welfare recipients and provides the manpower services they need to get jobs and become self-supporting.

The remainder of the money was allocated to agencies which sponsor Neighborhood Youth Corpos (NYC) and Operation Mainstream (OM) projects throughout the State. NYC gives jobs to young persons from poor families to help them stay in school or, if they are dropouts, to help them prepare for unsubsidized employment. The in-school segments were funded through the end of the school year, the out-of-school till July 20.

Mainstream projects, now funded through August, give jobs to older workers who have suffered unemployment.

\$38,704 for 54 NYC in-school enrollees and 18 out-of-school enrollees

\$25,050 for 12 OM enrollees

Hutchinson: Hutchinson Community Junior College

\$41,976 for 73 NYC in-school enrollees and 16 out-of-school enrollees

\$24,283 for 13 OM enrollees

Ottawa: East Central Kansas Community Action Program

\$19,120 for 14 OM enrollees

Topeka: Shawnee County Community Assistance and Action Program, Inc. \$39,300 for 33 NYC out-of-school enrollees (Unified School Dist. No. 501)

\$28,460 for 92 NYC in-school enrollees.

Wichita: City of Wichita

\$105,614 for 60 NYC tout-of-school enrollees

\$56,870 for 26 OM enrollees

Winfield: Winfield Unified School District No. 465

\$30,974 for 47 NYC in school enrollees and 14 out-of-school enrollees

\$33,537 for 20 OM enrollees
