OVER \$6.5 MILLION FOR KANSAS STUDENTS FROM HEW GRANTS AND LOANS

WASHINGTON, D.C.--Senators Bob Dole and James Pearson today announced that \$6,541,533 has been made available to colleges and universities in Kansas by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare. \$2,428,577 has been approved for universities and colleges participating in the Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants Program and \$4,112,976 for the National Direct Student Loan Program.

Under the Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants Program, grants to 3,479 individuals, made through colleges and universities, will range from \$200 to \$1,500 for each year of undergraduate study. Each grant requires a provision of an equal amount of financial assistance to eligible students from another source of aid. Following are postsecondary institutions in Kansas that will receive over \$50,000 for their programs and the number of students that will receive aid from each:

Federal Federal funds will provide 90% of the new capital contributions to National Direct Student Loan Program funds and a matching institutional contribution will provide the remaining 10%. 9,790 students at 50 Kansas universities and colleges will receive NDS loans.
