NEARLY HALF MILLION DOLLARS TO FUND SUMMER JOBS FOR KANSAS YOUTHS

WASHINGTON, D.C.--Senators Bob Dole and James Pearson today announced Department of Labor allocations totaling more than half a million dollars to give summer work to 1,600 disadvantaged Kansas youths in three localities.

Am allocation of \$314,000 will go to the City of Kansas City, Kansas and Wyandotte County, whose joint projects will give jobs to 668 young persons.

The City of Wichita will provide 880 summer jobs with \$208,568.

And the project operated jointly by Johnson and Leavenworth counties was allocated \$62,179 to fund 134 summer jobs.

The funds are distributed under provisions of the new Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA). CETA turns authority and responsibility for manpower programs over to states, cities and counties with over 100,000 population or groups of local governments of which at least one has more than 100,000.
