WASHINGTON, D.C.--Calling it a vote against "unfair discrimination," Senator Bob Dole today supported a resolution to allow an already deferred pay raise for some white collar civil servants to go into effect. Dole, who had authored a similar resolution, was an original sponsor of the measure that passed 64-35 today.

"This year alone," Dole said, "I have taken the lead in efforts on the Senate floor to cut spending bills to what I thought was a bare minimum. With the help of those Senators that agreed with me, we have been able to turn the tide of Senate sentiment and trim nearly \$8 billion from the federal budget."
