## DOLE, SHRIVER MEET WITH ADMINISTRATION REPRESENTATIVES TO DISCUSS FEDERAL BUILDING

WASHINGTON, D.C.--Administration representatives told Senator Bob Dole and Congressman Garner Shriver today that they are continuing to explore the proposals for construction of a Federal Court House and Office Building in Wichita.

The two Kansans met with representatives of the Office of Management and Budget, and the General Services Administration in Dole's office Thursday morning. In a joint statement after the meeting, Dole and Shriver said, "The need for a new structure is apparent to us. The Courts certainly need more space than they presently have, and many other agencies of the Federal Government, which are scattered in several locations around the City, are having to make do with facilities that are less than adequate."

There is still some doubt about the extent of future space requirements for some Federal offices, but OMB representatives told Dole and Shriver they would discuss space requirements further with the Postal Service and the Courts.

Senator James Pearson, who is in Kansas, was also represented at this morning's meeting by a member of his staff.
