DOLE EXPECTS GRAIN INSPECTION CONFERENCE TO RE-CONVENE AFTER DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION

WASHINGTON, D.C.—Senator Bob Dole, who Monday proposed a new grain inspection compromise, said today that he expects the Joint Conference Committee considering differences between House and Senate passed grain inspection bills, to re-convene following the recess for the Democratic Convention.

In letters to all members of the Conference, Dole had urged that it re-convene this week. In an effort to stimulate discussion and action and action toward resolving differences he also proposed a new compromise measure. "In talking with some of the conferees since they received my proposal," Dole said, "it appears we are moving toward a settlement of the three major differences between the two bills -- inspection at ports and inland points, and creation of a separate agency."

"I regret the Conference cannot be re-convened until after the recess for the Democratic Convention, but I am confident that some compromise will be reached soon after we return on July 19," Dole added.
