

MORE THAN 80% OF KANSANS FEEL 'WORSE' ABOUT NATION'S PROSPECTS, SURVEY SHOWS

WASHINGTON-- A recent survey of Kansans taken by Senator Bob Dole indicated that more than 80 percent say they feel "worse" about the direction the nation is moving, as compared to the way they felt a year ago.

The survey, which was compiled from responses to a questionnaire sent out as part of a constituent newsletter in April, also found that 52.1% of those responding favor the registration of young people for the armed forces, 76.3% favor a constitutional amendment requiring a balanced budget, and nearly three-fifths (59.9%) said they were "not satisfied" with President Carter's handling of the American hostage situation in Iran.

'A Tremendous Response'

According to Senator Dole, "while the survey was not a scientific one, and thus should be viewed in that light, I do believe it probably reflects the views of Kansans pretty accurately. We had a tremendous response-- more than 20,000 returns from a constituent mailing of 283,768-- which I think indicates that Kansans are anxious to make their views, and frustrations, known to their elected officials."
