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DOLE PURSUIT OF TAX CUT CONTINUES

Senator Bob Dole (R.-Kansas) today made the following floor statement:

"I am extremely disappointed by the decision of the Democratic leaderip in both Houses to block any tax cut legislation during the lame-duck
ssion. It seems that the current leadership in the Senate, the House
I the White House is allowing partisan politics to override the national
terest. If there was any mandate from the recently completed landslide
ection, it was that Congress should be reducing both taxation and government
ending. We should be trying to get government off the backs of our
tizens. I am afraid that message is still not being heard by many of our
aders in Washington.

Economy Needs A Tax Cut

"This Senator has vigorously sought enactment of a tax cut because he neerely believes the economy needs one. Inflation is still raging at about percent. Although the economy has shown some signs of improvement recently, at experts predict at best we will have a sluggish economic recovery. The ployment rate went up again last month and interest rates are again shooting the stratosphere. I believe that things will get worse before they get tter.

"Experts who testified before the Finance Committee, including former airman of the Council of Economic Advisors in both Democratic and Republican ministrations, supported enactment of a tax cut now to be effective on nuary 1st. The analysis of Nobel Laurate Dr. Lawrence Klein demonstrated the Committee that a tax cut will significantly reduce inflation and employment, and boost economic growth when compared with doing nothing. Thus, fear that the leadership's current posture will simply further aggravate our onomic woes.

"I strongly believe that the Finance Committee Bill is balanced and ponsible legislation. It contains much-needed individual relief, as well productivity oriented changes. It is the result of much work over many ths. The bill was developed in a remarkable exercise of bipartisan unity. was reported from the Finance Committee by a 19 to 1 vote. While this is good bill, I am not inflexibly committed to all of its provisions. I am the willing to work with the House or any other group to achieve a bill that acceptable to all factions.

"This Senator and his Republican colleagues have made every effort to vide tax relief to the American people. On June 25 we introduced our own cut package and twice sought Senate approval of the measure by offering it a floor amendment on other legislation. Twice we were blocked by the ocratic Majority. After the leadership refused to bring the Finance Committee 1 to the floor, the Republicans again tried on their own only to again be arted.

Offered As An Amendment

"This Senator is not yet willing to throw in the towel and wait until next r for a tax cut. If we wait it is unlikely that a bill will be signed into ax cut law until June or July. Such relief will be too late to be of much p in the economic recovery. Taxes are going up on January 1st. That is n the American people need relief.

"I intend to pursue this matter by offering the Finance Committee Tax Cut as an amendment to any appropriate vehicle during this lame-duck session. e this strategy may only have a slim chance of succeeding, I believe that e it to the American people to keep trying as long as Congress is in ion."
