SAFETY TIPS FOR DISABLED CHILDREN FEATURED IN NATIONAL PROGRAM

WASHINGTON -Senator Bob Dole today announced the distribution of "Protect Your Disabled Child", a brochure designed to alert parents, teachers, and children to this notable element of the national Child Safety Program.

"I am pleased to endorse this publication which recognizes the special needs and vulnerability of some disabled children," said Senator Dole. "I intend to make certain that <u>PROTECT YOUR</u> <u>DISABLED CHILD</u> is made available at Child Safety Days being conducted in Kansas and encourage community leaders throughout the nation to secure this brochure."

A personal information kit noting distinguishing characteristics, with dental charts and fingerprints, is prepared for parents to take home from Child Safety Day programs.
