SENATE CONFIRMS KANSAN WAYNE ANGELL FOR FEDERAL RESERVE BOARD

WASHINGTON -- Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole (R-KS) announced today that the Senate confirmed Kansas banker and farmer Wayne Angell as a member of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System. Angell, from Plains, Kansas, was Dole's pick for the important economic post.

"Wayne Angell's credentials make him an invaluable and unique addition to the Fed," Dole said. "He's a real live farmer, a top flight banker and a respected economist. For too long, the Federal Reserve Board has needed a voice from the heartlands. Now, it will be getting a dose of Kansas common sense."

"Wayne has served as a director of the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City and has extensive experience in banking with both banks and bank holding companies. And most important, for the nation's farmers, he has been active in agriculture since 1950," Dole concluded.
