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KANSAS PROJECTS APPROVED BY SENATE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE

Washington, D.C. -- Kansas Senator Bob Dole today announced that the Senate Appropriations Committee has approved funding for a variety of Kansas military construction and water development projects.

"I was pleased that the Committee decided to fund these Kansas projects. They represent the continuing effort to sustain our military commitment and to protect Kansas communities from the threat of flooding," said Dole.

"One community which had a close call with flooding several years ago was Arkansas City. The Committee's approval of funding for an overall engineering plan means that designs are underway to go ahead with a flood control project in the future," Dole stated.

"The Committee approved \$20 million to construct 272 new housing units at Fort Leavenworth. This construction represents an important step towards improving the quality of life of our military families at the base," said Dole.
