

DOLE ON SADDAM & HOSTAGES

TIMID CONGRESS STILL NOT A PLAYER

IF THE HOSTAGES REALLY DO COME OUT, CONGRESS WON'T BE ABLE TO TAKE ANY CREDIT, THAT'S FOR SURE -- IT'S BEEN SITTING ON THE SIDELINES FROM DAY ONE.

DESPITE THE MIXED SIGNALS CLUTTERING THE AIRWAVES FROM CAPITOL HILL, IT LOOKS LIKE SADDAM IS FINALLY HEARING THE ADMINISTRATION'S TOUGH MESSAGE LOUD AND CLEAR.

SADDAM'S OFFER IS THE LATEST EVIDENCE THAT THE PRESIDENT'S POLICY OF STRENGTH AND RESOLVE IN THE GULF IS PAYING DIVIDENDS. WHILE PRESIDENT BUSH AND THE UNITED NATIONS HAD THE COURAGE TO FORCE SADDAM'S HAND, CONGRESS SAT ON ITS HANDS AND TRIED TO TIE THE PRESIDENT'S BEHIND HIS BACK.
