PRESIDENT BUSH DESIGNATES KANSAN TO SERVE ON
COMMISSION FOR THE PRESERVATION OF AMERICA'S HERITAGE ABROAD

Republican Leader Bob Dole (R-KS) today applauded President Bush's appointment of Stan Rose, of Overland Park, to the Commission for the Preservation of America's Heritage Abroad.

"Stan will be a welcome addition to this Commission," Dole said. "He's well-respected in Kansas and is a keen student of America's history and heritage. I will value his input and guidance."

Rose was recommended to President Bush by Senator Dole last year. Rose serves as Chairman and Publisher of Sun Publications, which publishes 18 semi-weekly and 2 weekly publications.

The Commission for the Preservation of America's Heritage Abroad identifies and publishes a list of those cemeteries, monuments, and historic buildings located abroad which are associated with the foreign heritage of the United States citizens from eastern and central Europe. The Commission is dedicated and committed to the preservation of these religious sites in Eastern Europe and throughout the Middle East.
