DOLE ANNOUNCES STAFF CHANGES FOR KANSAS OPERATIONS

WASHINGTON - Kansas Senator Bob Dole today announced several staff changes in his state operations in Washington and Kansas.

Dan Stanley of Kansas City, Kansas, will become Senator Dole's Administrative Assistant. Stanley, who attended the University of Kansas, has served Senator Dole as Assistant to the Republican Leader on defense policy for 2 1/2 years. Previously, he was Director of Strategic Business Assessment for McDonnell Douglas Corporation. Stanley also has 12 years in the U. S. Navy Service and continues his service as an officer in the Navy Reserves. Stanley replaces Jim Wholey, who has served since 1989 and had earlier announced plans to return to the private sector. In the interim, Wholey will continue as consultant to Senator Dole on telecommunications issues.

Dave Spears of Osborne, will become State Director for Senator Dole beginning the first of July, 1992. Spears, a graduate of Kansas State University, has been a Legislative Assistant on agriculture and related issues for Senator Dole since 1989 and will continue to oversee this area of responsibility. Previously, he served for 10 years as Assistant Vice President at CoBank - National Bank for Cooperatives, Wichita, working in agribusiness financing. Spears replaces Mike Glassner, who will direct Senator Dole's reelection campaign from the Topeka headquarters.

"Jim's done a good job for me and I wish him all the best. Dan will be a fine successor, focusing on priority state projects and working with my Kansas staff to ensure that Kansans get the service they deserve from Washington," said Dole.

"I'm also pleased that Dave Spears will be moving back to Kansas as my State Director. Dave will coordinate my Kansas operations, focusing on state projects and constituent services out of my offices in Wichita, Topeka, Kansas City and Pittsburg," said Dole.
