DOLE ANNOUNCES \$4.5 MILLION IN PUBLIC HOUSING GRANTS FOR KANSAS CITIES

WASHINGTON - Kansas Senator Bob Dole announced today \$4,509,150 million in federal grants to improve low-income public housing facilities in Kansas cities statewide. The grants are awarded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

"Maintaining the living conditions at public housing facilities in Kansas is fundamental," said Dole, "and these funds will help keep these important housing units in good shape. It is important that HUD provide assistance where it's needed, and that often means small and medium communities, not just the big East and West Coast urban centers."

The grants were awarded under the Housing Department's Comprehensive Improvement Assistance Program (CIAP). CIAP was established to finance the necessary repair and improvement of low-income public housing facilities constructed under authorization of the U.S. Housing Act. The CIAP grants, awarded to local housing authorities, are:
