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TWA LAUDS POLITICAL SUPPORT IN REACHING AGREEMENT WITH THE PENSION BENEFIT GUARANTY CORPORATION

Today, Trans World Airlines Inc., (TWA), its employee groups and its creditors expressed appreciation to a number of elected and appointed public officials for their involvement to assure the success of their efforts to reach this settlement agreement.

Mr. Glenn Zander, the Creditors Committee appointee to TWA's two man management committee said, "The attention to this matter by Republican Leader Dole was instrumental. With over 5,000 of our employees residing in the Kansas City area, TWA didn't have to ask for help, he offered it. Senator Dole helped coordinate the response from Capitol Hill and made it possible for us to have our voice fairly heard by the appropriate officials."

During the last 12 days our phones were ringing off the hook. While most calls brought new problems to be resolved it seemed like every third call was from Dick Gephardt or his staff asking what more they could do to help us keep TWA flying and our employees working. Any request we made of him was done. The skills which made Mr. Gephardt Majority Leader were quickly and often used on behalf of TWA.
