DOLE PROPOSAL FOR KAAP PROJECTS WINS FINAL SENATE APPROVAL

WASHINGTON - Kansas Senator Bob Dole's request for \$113.5 million for the procurement of the Sensor Fuzed Weapon at the Kansas Army Ammunition Plant won final Senate approval late Thursday.

"This funding will allow the Kansas Army Ammunition Plant in Parsons to sustain its important contribution to our armed forces," Dole said. "The Sensor Fuzed Weapon will continue to be a significant enhancement to our military forces."

The U.S. Senate also approved Senator Dole's request to grant \$5 million for the demilitarization of U.S. Air Force inventory SUU-30 dispensers.

"I am pleased that Congress has agreed with me on the importance of this project and the capability of the Parsons plant to carry out this effort," Dole added.

The projects were included in the 1995 Defense Appropriations Bill which now heads to the President's desk to be signed into law.
