

DOLE NAMES ELIZABETH GREENE SECRETARY FOR THE MAJORITY; JOYCE McCLUNEY TO BE DEPUTY SERGEANT AT ARMS

WASHINGTON -- Senate Republican Leader Bob Dole today announced that he has selected Elizabeth Greene to be Secretary for the Majority, and Joyce McCluney to be Deputy Sergeant at Arms. Both appointments will be effective upon the start of the 104th Congress, and Greene's appointment will be presented to the Senate for confirmation when the Senate convenes January 4, 1995.

Elizabeth Greene currently serves as the floor assistant to the Secretary for the Minority. She has worked in the Senate since 1975, and has held various positions in and around the cloakroom and floor since 1981. She will succeed Howard Greene, current Secretary for the Minority, who has been named Senate Sergeant at Arms starting in the 104th Congress.

The Secretary for the Majority, an officer of the Senate, oversees the cloakroom operation, and facilitates communication between the Republican Senators and the Republican Leader regarding legislative activity on the Senate floor.

Joyce McCluney has been office manager in the Office of the Republican Leader since 1987, and in the Office of the Majority Leader from 1985 to 1987. She previously held staff positions with the Senate Finance Committee, the White House, the Commerce Department and the State Department.

As Deputy Sergeant at Arms, McCluney will help administer the office supervising Senate departments including the computer center, post office, press galleries, service department, recording studio, and telecommunications services.
